Nominations for the award may be submitted by anyone including the nominee, WEAO members, municipalities, consultants, researchers, the general public, or other interested parties. Nominees do not have to be members of WEAO.

Nominated entries may include both individuals and groups from either private or public organizations that demonstrate excellence in the area of residuals & biosolids management. This includes but is not necessarily limited to producers, users, land appliers, researchers, technology developers, haulers, and farming organizations.
